2.A. **EMERGENCY PROCEDURES - PUBLIC COMMENTS TO THE CITY COMMISSION**

During this time of extraordinary circumstances dealing with the Declared Emergency associated with COVID-19, the City is temporarily transitioning to online public participation comments for City Commission meetings consistent with the goals of the Governor's Executive Order 20-91, Essential Services and Activities during the COVID-19 Emergency. In lieu of in-person public participation, the City is providing an online Public Comment form prior to each City Commission meeting for submission to the Commission by members of the public that still desire to make comments. Below is a link to the online Public Comment form. Please follow the directions on the form to ensure submission.

All Public Comment form submissions completed and properly emailed to the City within the timeline outlined below will be provided to City Commission members for their review and consideration prior to the meeting and will be included in the official meeting records held by the City Clerk, City of Daytona Beach. The Public Comment form will be accessible and may be submitted until the end of the City Commission meeting. Public Comment forms submitted before to 5 p.m. on the day of the meeting will be

provided to the Commission before the meeting. Any Public Comment forms submitted after 5 p.m. on the day of meeting will be provided to Commission after the meeting. Although persons are strongly encouraged to submit Public Comment forms online, persons may also visit City Hall during the Commission meeting and present written comments on forms provided by the City. The lobby area of City Hall will be equipped with a drop-off box for written comment forms. Written comment forms on any specific item to be voted on by the Commission will be distributed to the Commission prior to the vote being taken. All other written comment forms will be distributed to the City Commission after the meeting. Persons may view the Commission meeting from monitors in the lobby area of City Hall, however, no more than 10 persons inclusive of any necessary City Staff will be allowed in the City Hall lobby at any one time. All persons must comply with social distancing requirements while at City Hall, such as by remaining at least 6 feet apart. Use of facial masks is encouraged.

3. Resolution Extending the Local State of Emergency

- 3.A.** A Resolution extending the Local State of Emergency due to COVID-19 for an additional seven-day period ending May 12, 2020; temporarily authorizing the operation of outdoor seating areas by eating/drink establishments consistent with Governor DeSantis' Executive Order 20-112, subject to conditions; temporarily delegating to the City Manager authority to grant licenses for encroachment of restaurant-related outdoor seating areas onto public sidewalks under Section 5.3.C.17 of the Land Development Code; suspending certain requirements set forth in Subpart A, Article V, Section 20, City Charter, with respect to the verification of signatures required for nominating petitions filed for the 2020 City Municipal Election, subject to conditions, authorizing Planning Board and Redevelopment Boards to have public meeting subject to conditions; waiving late payment fees for City Utility customers during the Local State of Emergency; and providing an effective date.
