

First manhole set as MLK Streetscape work continues

100-feet of sanitary sewer installed

Updates:

At the Magnolia Avenue and MLK intersection, the most critical and deepest sanitary manhole was set this week and 100-feet of sanitary sewer has been installed toward the Orange Avenue intersection. The crews are now backfilling and compacting the new sanitary lines around the pipes to achieve proper densities of the soil so that the roadway will be safe from settling in the future. Also this week, Florida Power & Light set new concrete poles on MLK and will be back next week to move the power to the new poles. Next week the crews will demolish another 100-feet of roadway asphalt, set the well points to get rid of the ground water and continue installing the next section of the sanitary sewer.

All businesses along MLK are accessible to pedestrians. Pedestrians should not walk through the work area. If walking around the work site perimeter, pedestrians are urged to use caution.

Local traffic is permitted from Orange Avenue north to the work zone and from International Speedway Blvd. south to the work zone. All through traffic is being routed around the area via Orange Avenue, Segrave Street, Lockhart Street and International Speedway Blvd.

Project Overview:

The \$2.6 million project will completely reconstruct the road's surface, update underground utilities, widen sidewalks, install decorative lighting features and landscaping and add on-street parking on the east side of the roadway.
