

**Crews make water connections  
between new and existing  
underground utilities**

**Properties being connected to new water system  
between Orange Avenue and Magnolia Avenue**

In coordination with city staff installing new water service lines and meter boxes for each property between Orange Avenue and Magnolia Avenue, almost all of the sidewalk has been installed on the east side of the roadway in this section of MLK. Crews are back in the Magnolia Avenue and MLK intersection this week, which will be closed as they make water connections between the new and existing underground utilities. This work should be completed by the end of next week. Crews are also continuing to install the new sanitary sewer and underground utilities between Foote Court and Magnolia Avenue.

As city utilities staff complete the process of connecting properties into the new water system, there is always a potential for short-term service interruptions. City staff will continue to inform property owners about the utility construction process, and contact them individually and in advance, if there are any planned boil water notices that will occur as part of the construction work. If it is necessary to boil water, a notice for a property will be provided by staff leaving informational door hangers. The utility improvements that are part of this road project will upgrade all of the outdated infrastructure and provide residents in this area with more efficient and reliable water service. This also means that if there is a need for a water service outage after the current construction is completed, it will be confined to fewer properties versus affecting the entire area.

Businesses on MLK remain open as road improvements continue between Orange Avenue and International Speedway Boulevard. The area has detour signage, as well as signs for all businesses in the area. Customers can park temporarily in the right-of-way on the side streets to access the businesses. Pedestrians should not walk through the work area. If walking around the work site perimeter, pedestrians are urged to use caution.
