

**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 10 OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH  
RELATING TO LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY DUE TO COVID-19, EXTENDING  
LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY AND AMENDING THE EMERGENCY ORDER  
REQUIRING FACIAL COVERINGS**

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order 20-51 on March 1, 2020, authorizing and directing the State Health Officer and Surgeon General to declare a public health emergency in the state of Florida as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, I, as Mayor of The City of Daytona Beach, issued a Declaration of a Local State of Emergency dated March 13, 2020, and an Amended Declaration of a Local State of Emergency and Executive Order dated March 17, 2020, for an initial seven day period; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission has affirmed, endorsed, and extended the Local State of Emergency for successive additional seven day periods, most recently by Resolution 2020-166, which extended the Local State of Emergency due to COVID-19 until 11:59 p.m. on July 8, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2020-165 contained an order for all persons to wear “Face Coverings” while located in any indoor location other than their home or business, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2020-185 amended and restated the above-referenced order in Resolution No. 2020-165, to establish an additional exception to the “Face Coverings” requirement, for child daycare centers and all primary and secondary school facilities, public or private; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 continues to be a threat to the public health of an unknown duration; and

WHEREAS, as the Mayor of The City of Daytona Beach, I have determined that an extension of the Local State of Emergency for an additional seven day period ending at 11:59 p.m. on July 15, 2020, is necessary to protect the health and welfare of the citizens in the City due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, as Mayor of The City of Daytona Beach, I have further determined that it is necessary to amend by this executive order, the Amended and Restated Emergency Order Requiring Facial Coverings in Resolution No. 2020-185, to require business establishments to post signage notifying all persons of the requirements of the Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH:


SECTION 1. The Local State of Emergency as described in the recitals above is hereby reaffirmed, endorsed, and extended until 11:59, July 22, 2020, unless sooner terminated or extended by order of the Mayor or action of City Commission.

SECTION 2. During the Local State of Emergency, emergency measures may be exercised as set forth in Section 2-3, City Code, and the Mayor shall have authority to execute executive orders as necessary to aid in their appropriate implementation.

SECTION 3. The Emergency Order Requiring Facial Coverings (Section 1 of Resolution No. 20-185), is hereby amended to require all business establishments to post signage notifying all persons of the requirement to wear Face Coverings as referenced in said Order. For purposes herein, “business establishment” means any indoor location within the City with a roof overhead, in which any business is conducted, goods are made or stored or processed, or where services are rendered. The term “business establishment” includes transient public lodging establishments as described in Fla. Stat. § 509.013(4)(a)1, indoor locations under roof where non-

profit and quasi-governmental entities facilitate interactions or conduct business, and indoor locations used as places of worship; but does NOT include daycare centers, primary or secondary school facilities, or facilities owned or operated by government agencies.
